



## PERSON SPECIFICATION: Livestock Ranger

You will be responsible for assisting with the day-to-day care and management of the Trusts livestock and completing tasks identified within the work plan & as identified by the Lead Ranger. You will perform your role as a Livestock Ranger within a small team, or as an independent Ranger. You will enable everyone to feel welcome and instil outstanding and inspirational experiences of our conservation work. You will be part of a broader team of staff on the Estate delivering great service to visitors including managing volunteers. Working alongside our neighbours and partners in the local community, you'll communicate with other organisations, protecting and enhancing the Trust's assets and reputation.

### Scale & scope of the role:

Reports to: Estate Manager through the Lead Ranger

Line management: Manage volunteer groups and placements as required.

Nature of impact: (internal)

Responsible for delivery of tasks allocated by the Lead Ranger, will include but not limited to all aspects of livestock husbandry, general farm maintenance and tractor driving, and other duties requested. Use high level of competence to deal with problems without hands on support whilst delivering delegated items from the weekly work plan.

Nature of impact: (external)

Will maintain productive partnerships, especially those supporting local projects with a bearing on Box Moor Trust land. Regular day to day contact with public/stakeholders.

### Knowledge, skills & experience required:

- Practical experience in livestock handling and management.
- Working knowledge of Health & Safety legislation relevant to a countryside / agricultural setting.
- A full UK driving licence and experience in tractor and trailer driving both on and off-road.
- 'Hands on' experience with using machinery and equipment and able to carry out work tasks and projects using this type of equipment, including (but not limited to): Petrol/electric hand-held power tools. Competence certificates are desirable but training can be given to the right person.
- Able to build and maintain strong relationships both internally and externally.
- Able to demonstrate the ability to support colleagues, volunteers and trainees to perform at their best.
